The Southeastern Library Association has honored Judith Gibbons with the Mary Utopia Rothrock Award. This award honors a librarian who has contributed substantially to the furtherance of librarianship in the southeast during a career.

Gibbons, of Versailles, a retired Kentucky Department for Libraries and Archives Field Services Division Director, is involved in library activities on the state, regional and national level.

Gibbons is the former director of the Woodford County Library and a 40plus year librarian. She is currently on the adjunct faculty at the University of Kentucky College of Communications and Information, School of Information Science and a contributing columnist for "MLS: Marketing Library Services." Dr. Gordon Baker, Dean

of Libraries Emeritus at Clayton State University (Georgia) in his nomina-tion said, "Judith has made substantial contributions to both SELA and librarianship in our region. Judith continues to perform outstanding service to field of librarianship. She has been recognized by her peers in Kentucky. Judith has had a profound effect on SELA, KLA and our region's libraries.
